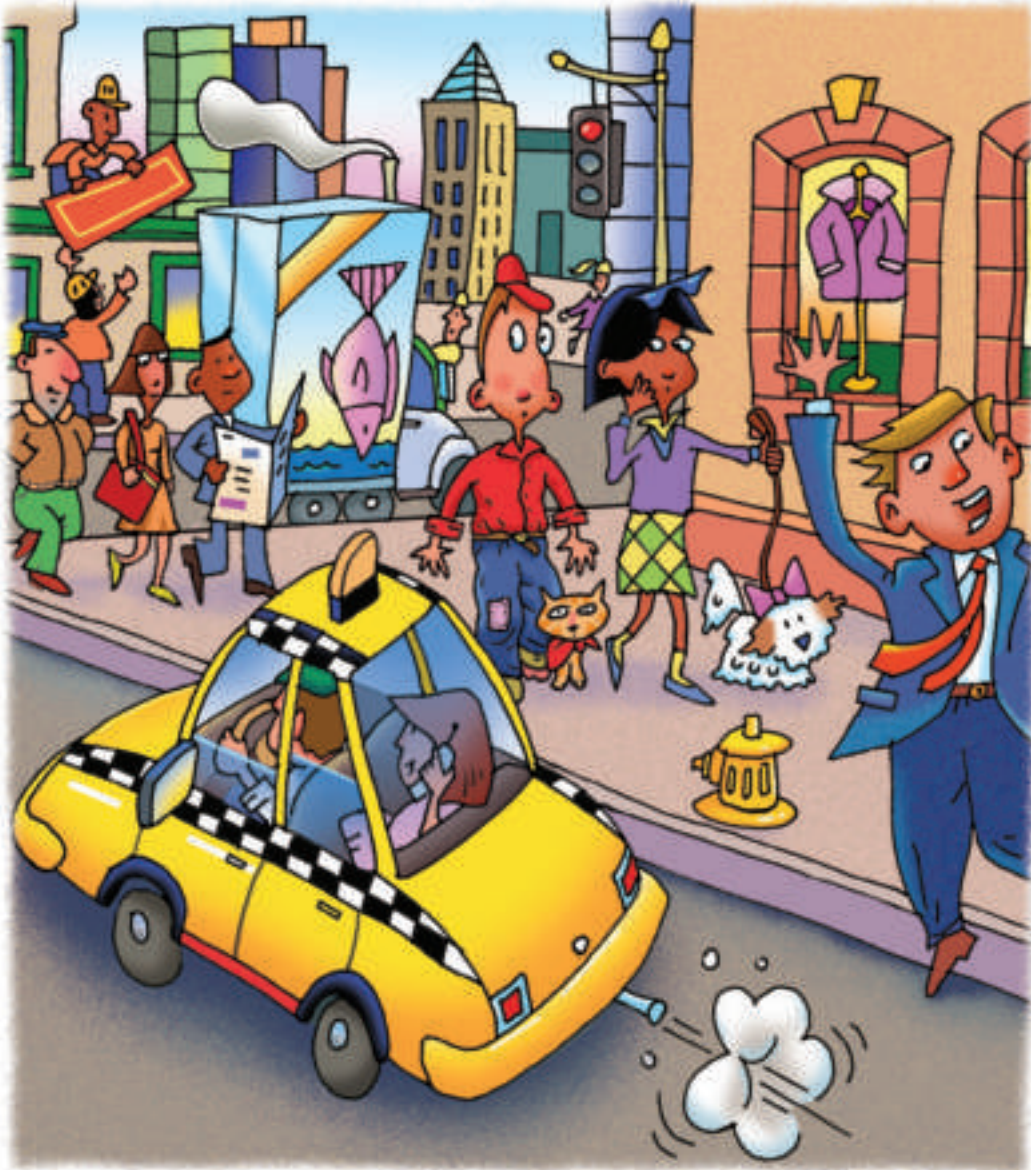

People live in the city, in the country, in deserts, in the mountains, and in the jungle. People live all over the Earth! Some places have many people. Some places do not have many people.

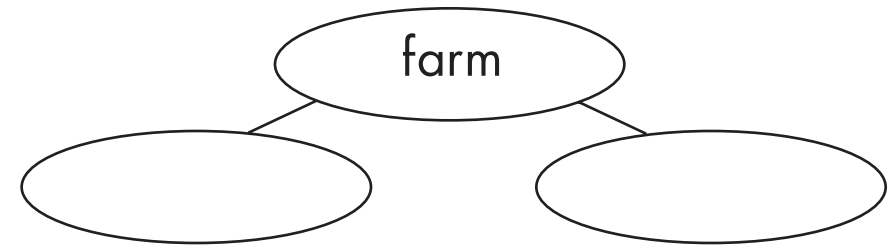
Where do you live? Do many people live there?
