"He is eating in this log."



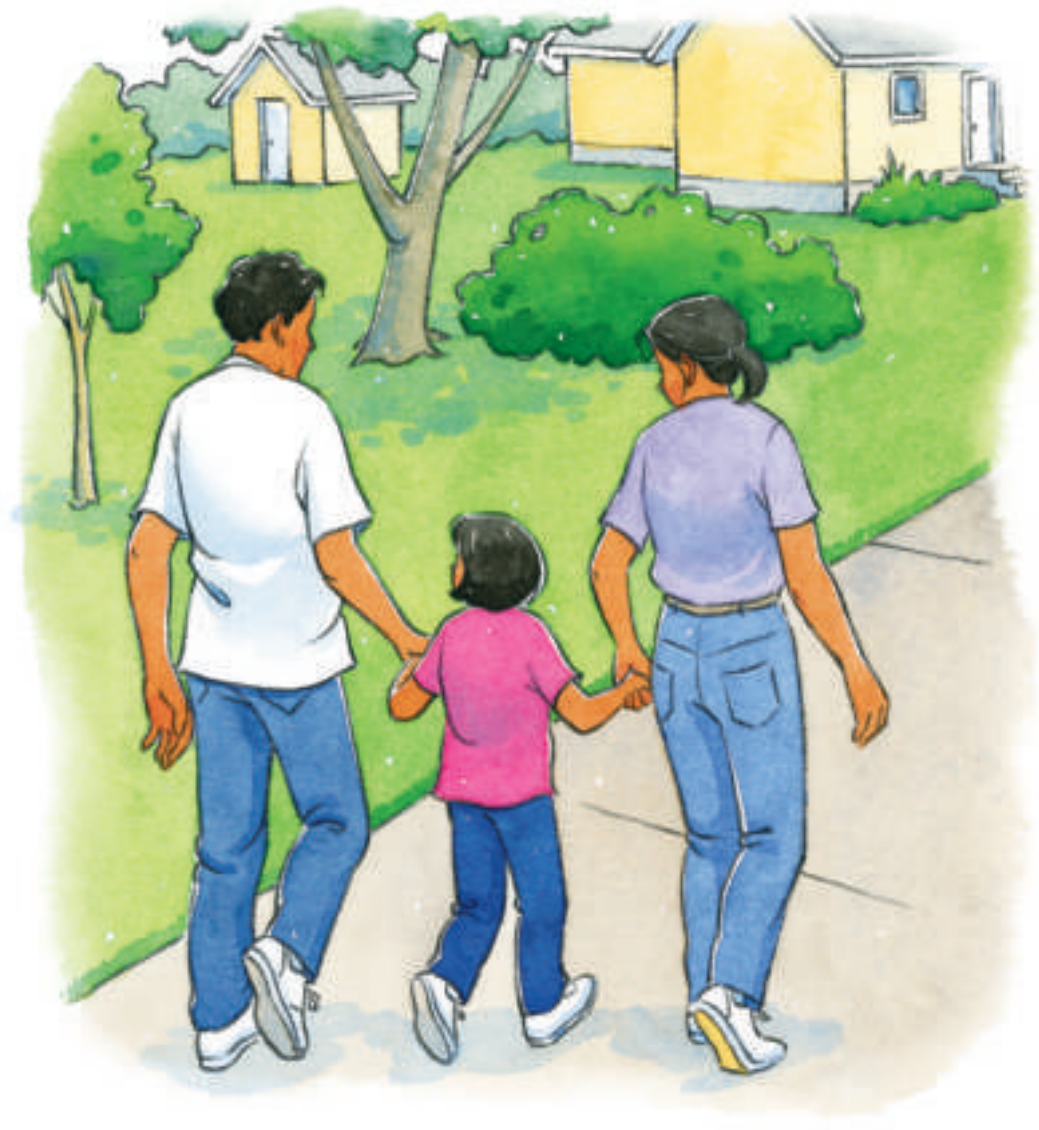
"Look in this tree," said Mom.
