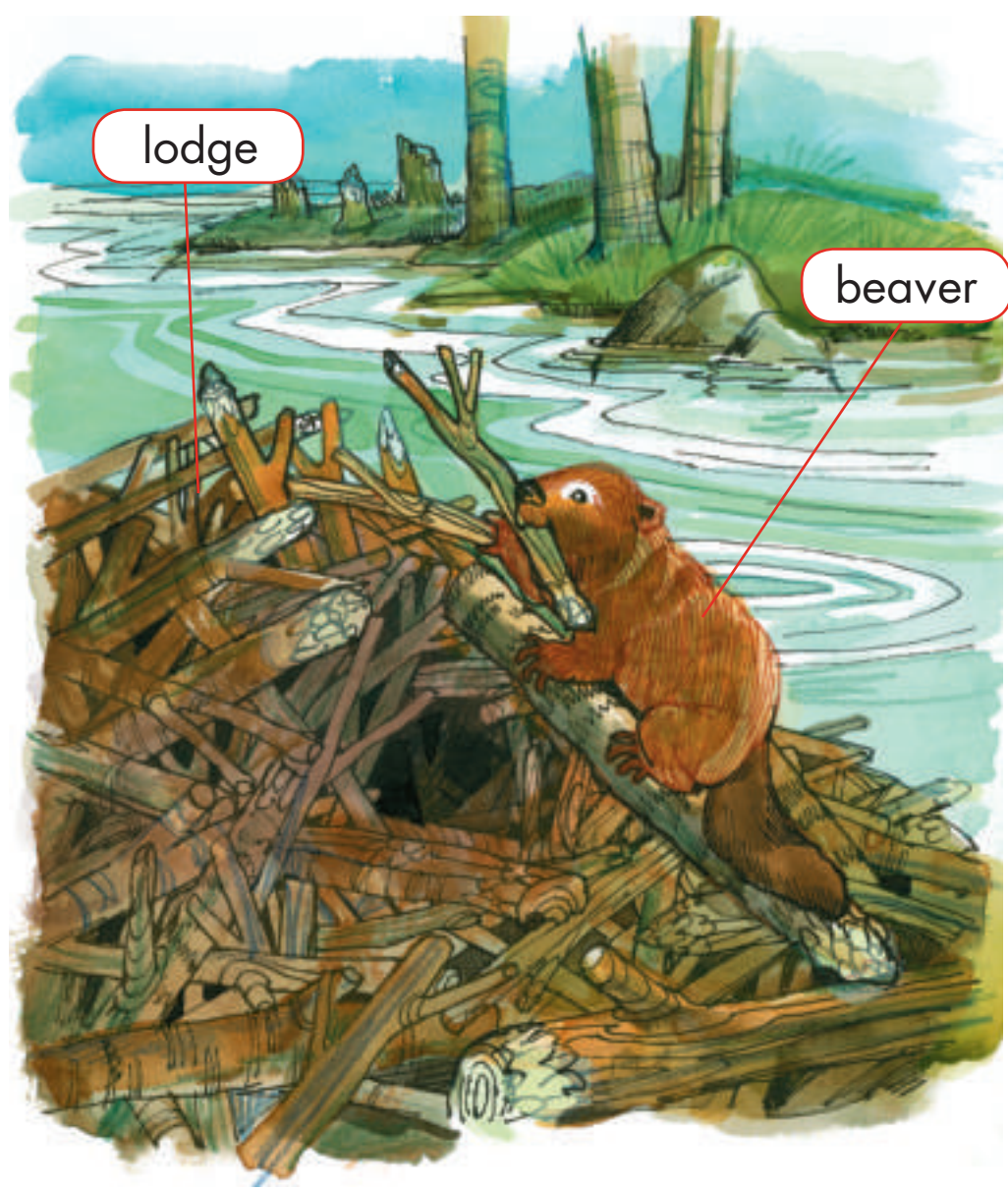

Who lives here? A beaver lives here.



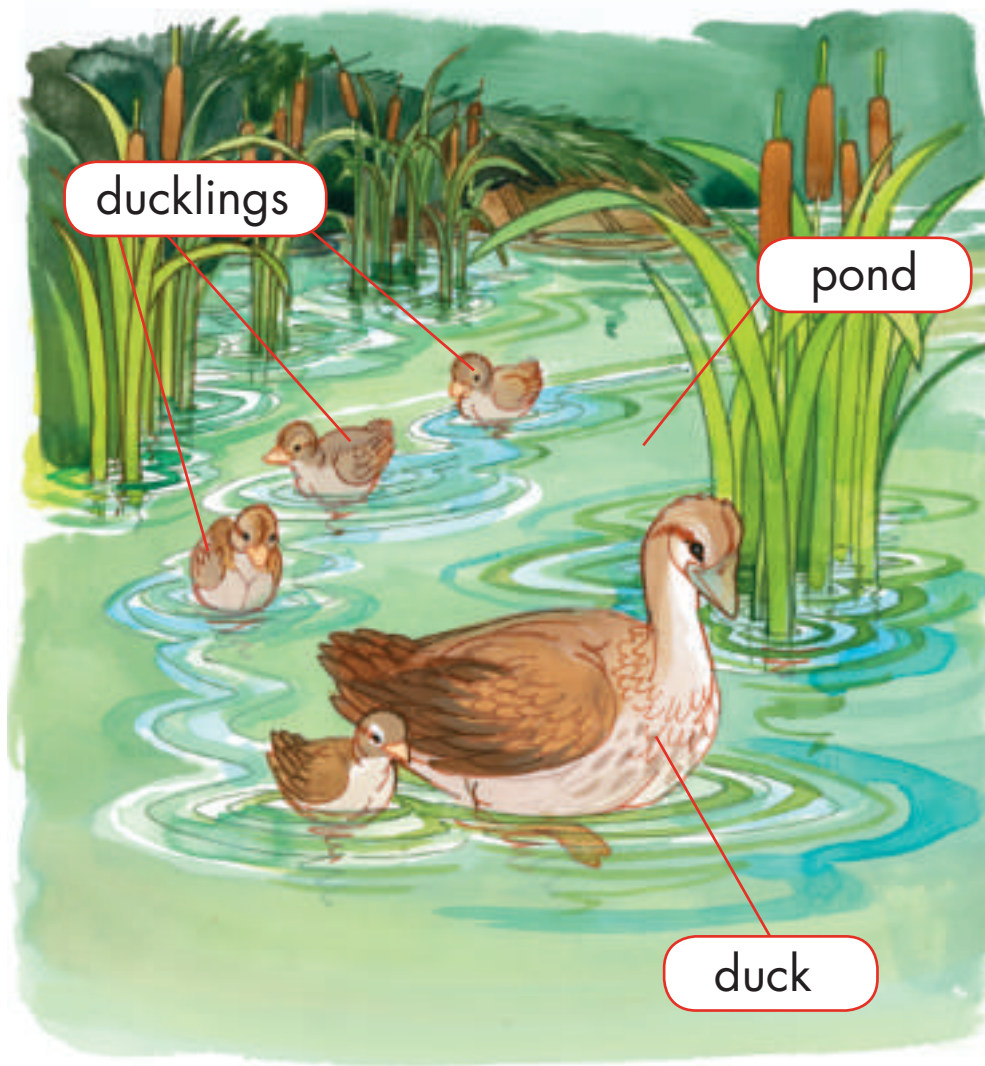


I saw a home of straw and mud.
