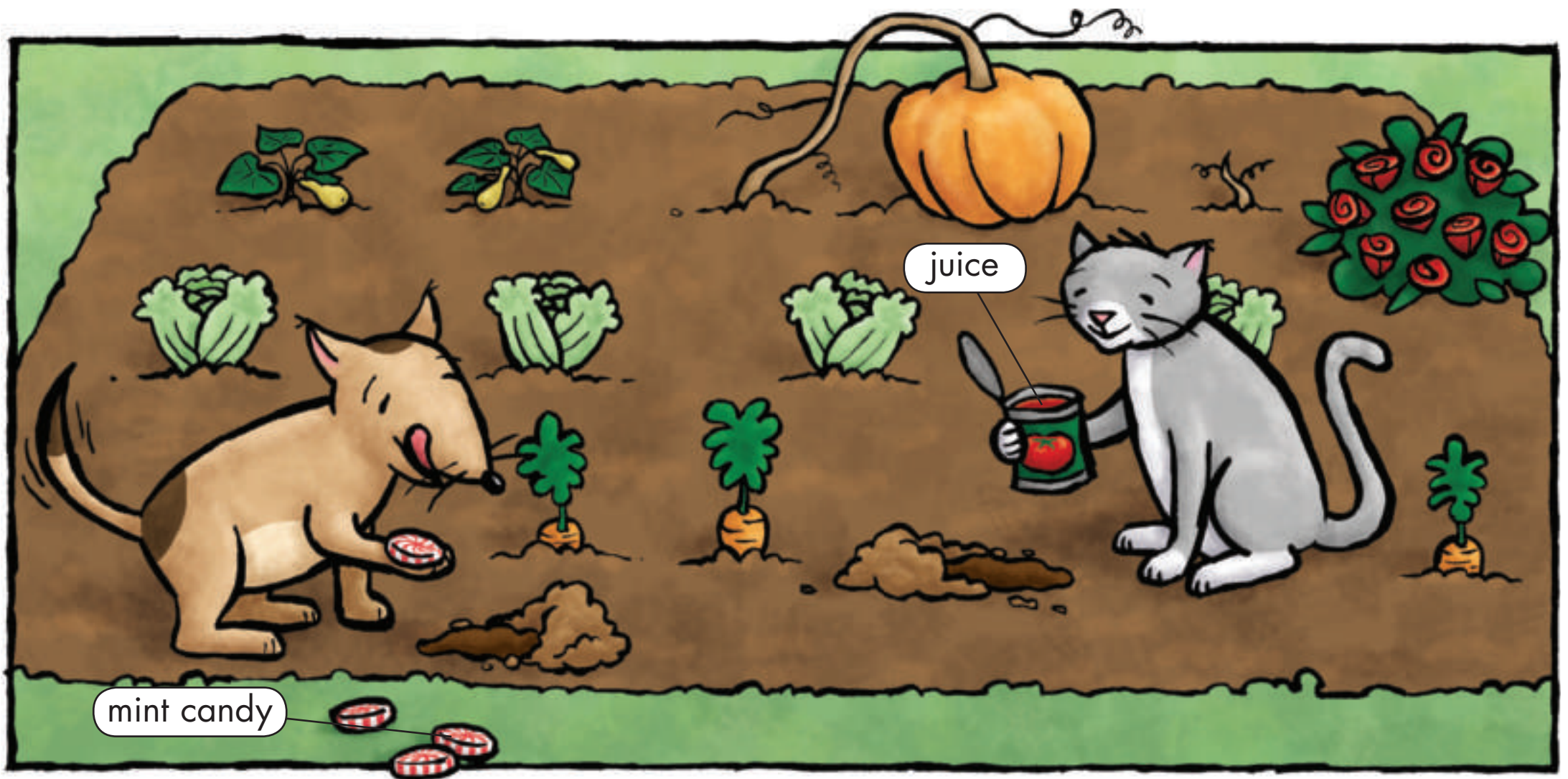


Dog and Cat are friends.
