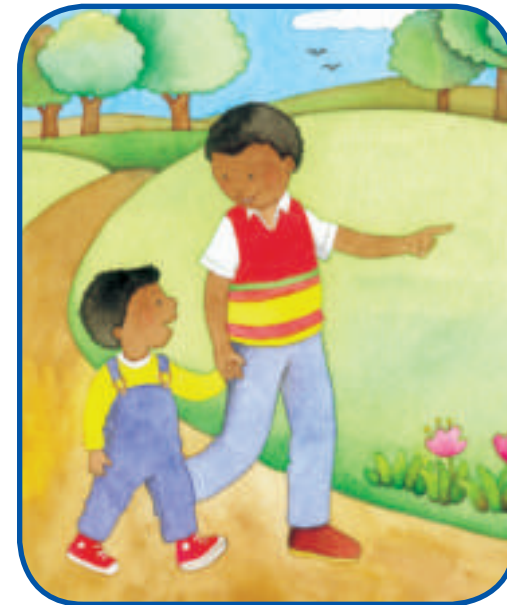

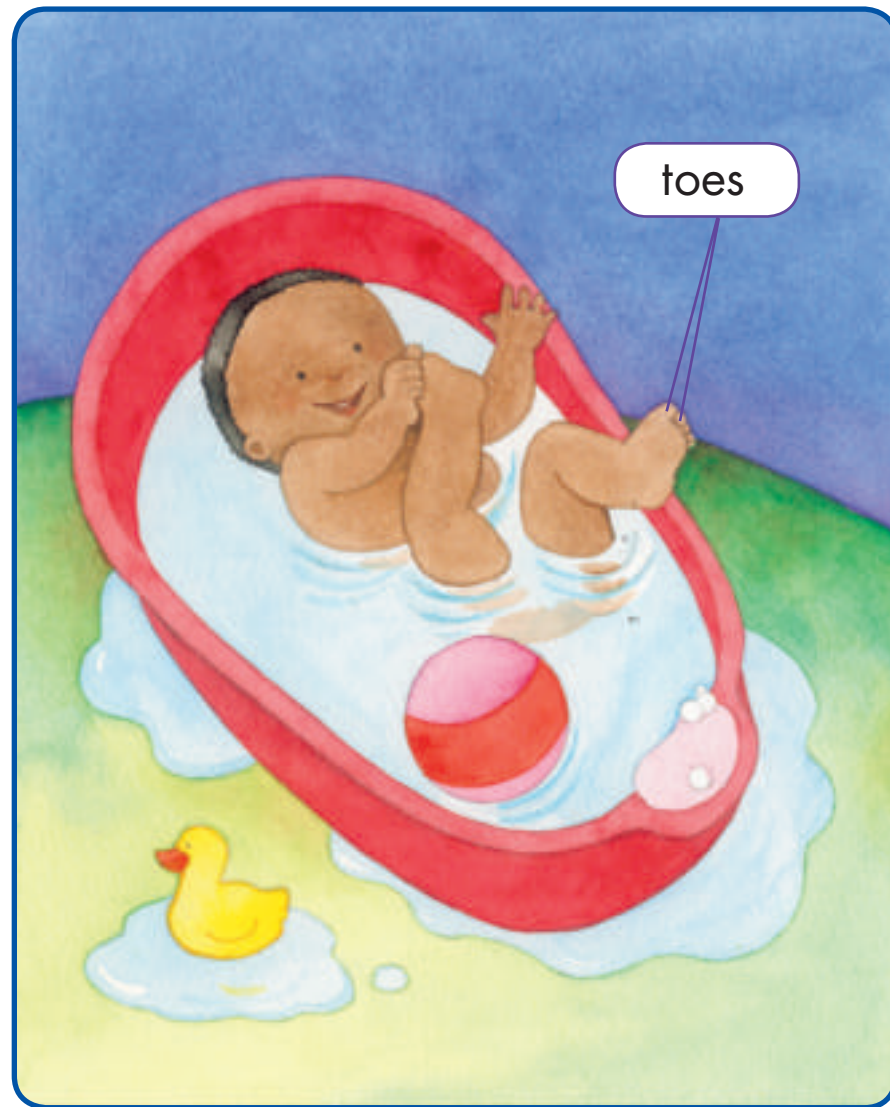

Now he can walk.

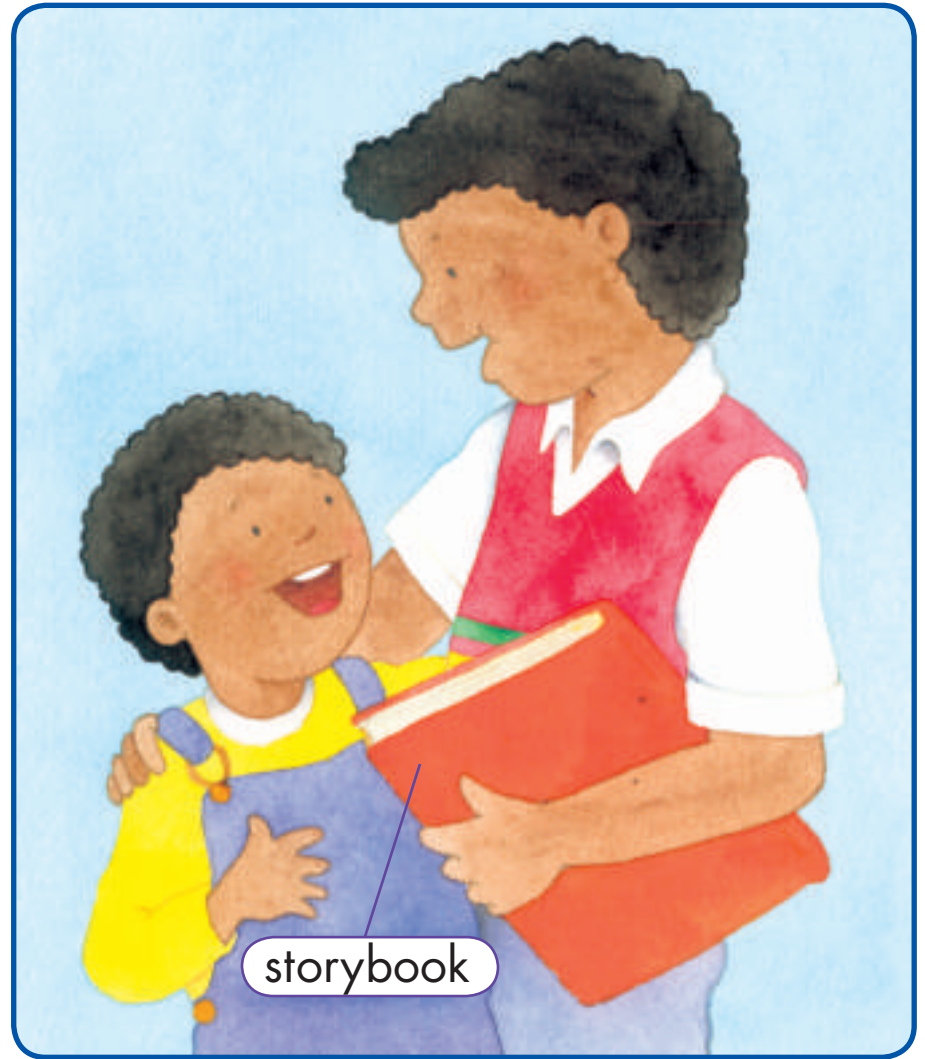


I like to feed birds.
