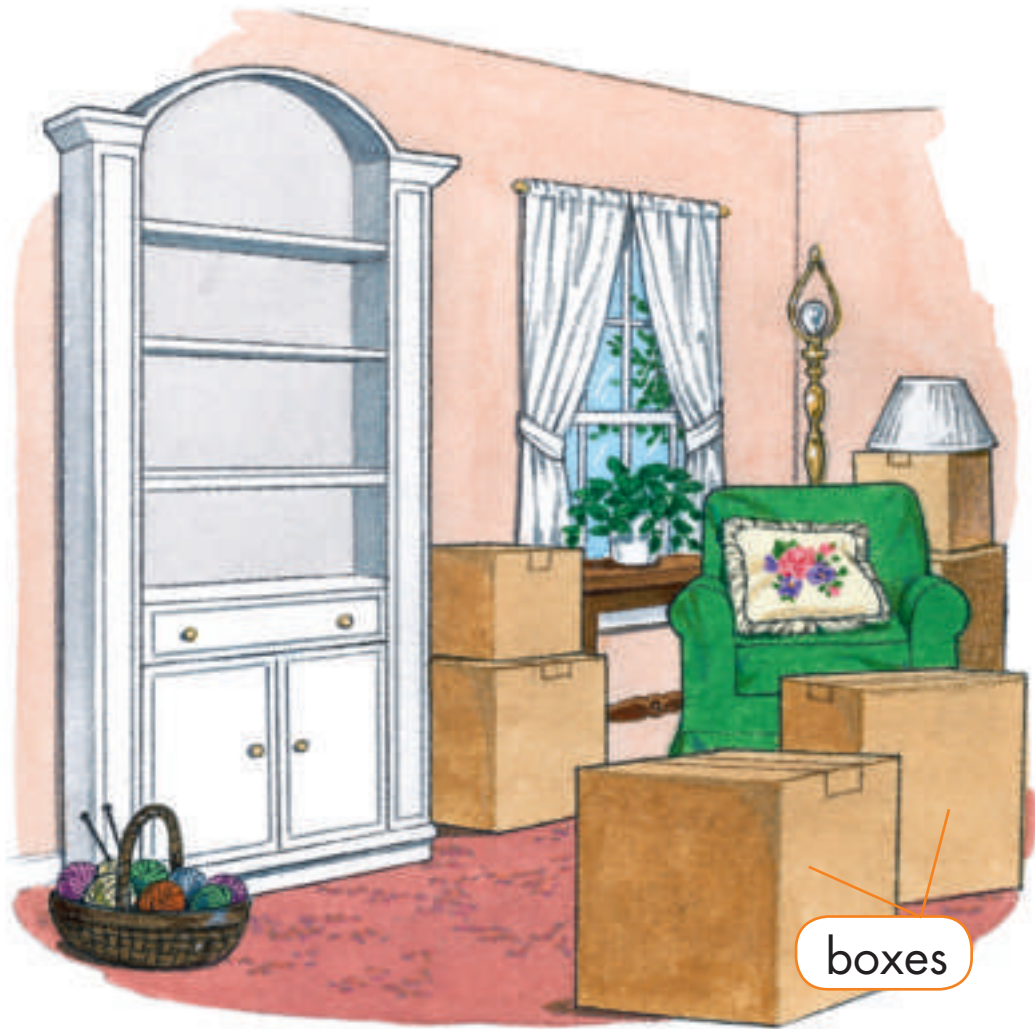

 Grandma opened a big box. "These are my treasures," she said. "Please put these special things on the shelves. Be careful." Jake and Pam started to work.



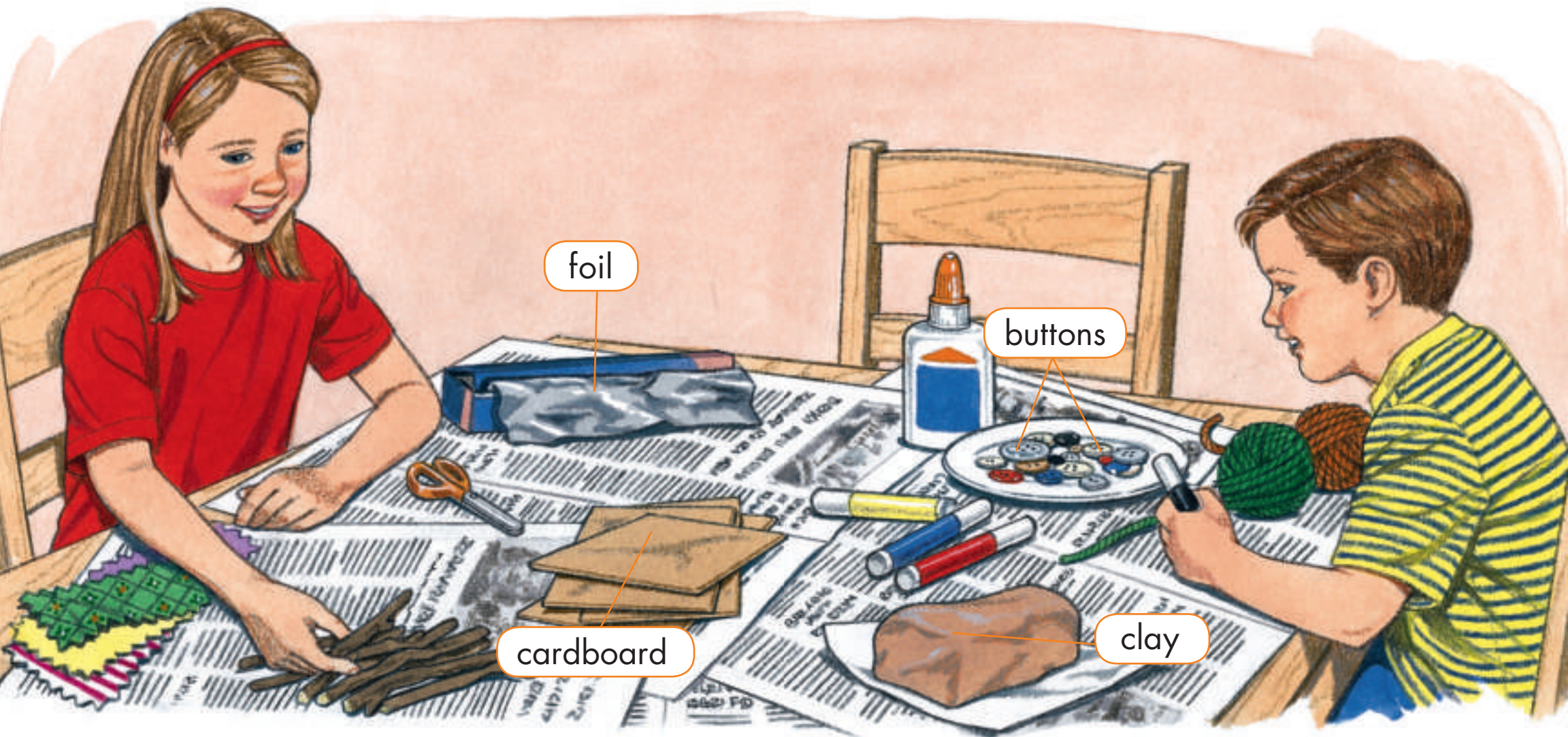


🔊 "This looks funny," Jake said.
